Avalanche rescue backpack , one (1) per person, containing a cartridge of compressed gas in Div. 2.2. Articles which have the primary purpose of a power source e.g. power banks, are considered as spare batteries. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits. <p>Lithium battery-powered electronic devices. Lithium ion batteries for portable (including medical) electronic devices, a Wh rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh. For portable medical electronic devices only, lithium metal batteries with a lithium metal content exceeding 2 g but not exceeding 8 g. Devices in checked baggage must be completely switched off and must be protected from damage.</p> <p><i>Note: Small vehicles powered with Lithium batteries such as Airwheel, Hoverboard, Segway, mini Segway, Balance wheel, etc are not allowed on Jet Airways flights</i></p>	YES	YES	YES	NO
<p>Lithium batteries, spare/loose with a Watt-hour rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh for consumer electronic devices and PMED or with a lithium metal content exceeding 2 g but not exceeding 8 g for PMED only.
